The first home Church plant was at Miss Elsie's home and Alinah's Home. From there, there was another at Mr Mosueu's Home. Even though the Church has been planted we still have home church plants and prayer meetings every Wednesday for women's ministry and Man Ministry called the Gatekeepers.

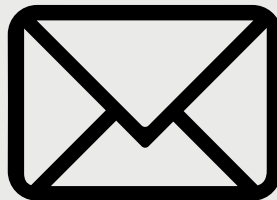

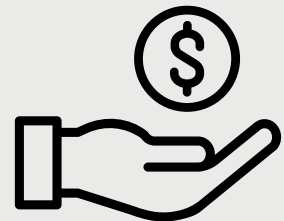
