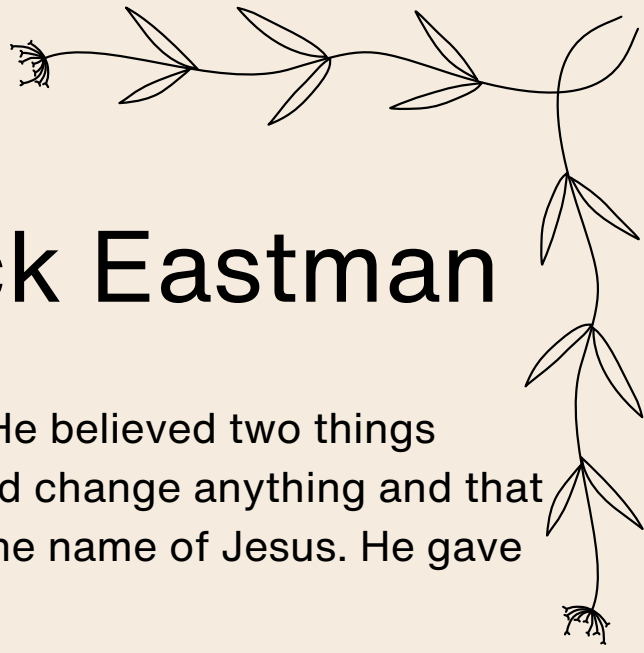

We mourn the passing of Dick Eastman. He believed two things throughout his whole life, that prayer could change anything and that every person on earth deserved to hear the name of Jesus. He gave everything he had to both.

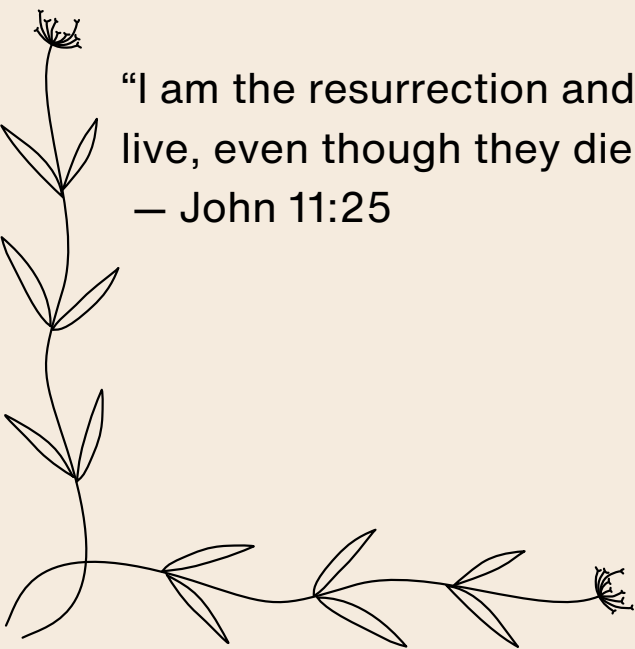
Dick served with Every Home for Christ for over 46 years, including 34 as international president. He authored 17 books on prayer and evangelism with more than 3 million copies in print. Under his leadership, the gospel reached families in 215 nations, resulting in over 150 million people responding to Jesus.

But the numbers only tell part of the story. What Dick cared about was faithfulness. Showing up. Praying when no one was watching. Believing God for the impossible and then getting out of the way. He leaves behind his beloved wife, Dee, daughters Dena and Ginger, and nine grandchildren, who were the joy of his life. He fought the good fight. He kept the faith. And, today, Dick Eastman finished the race.

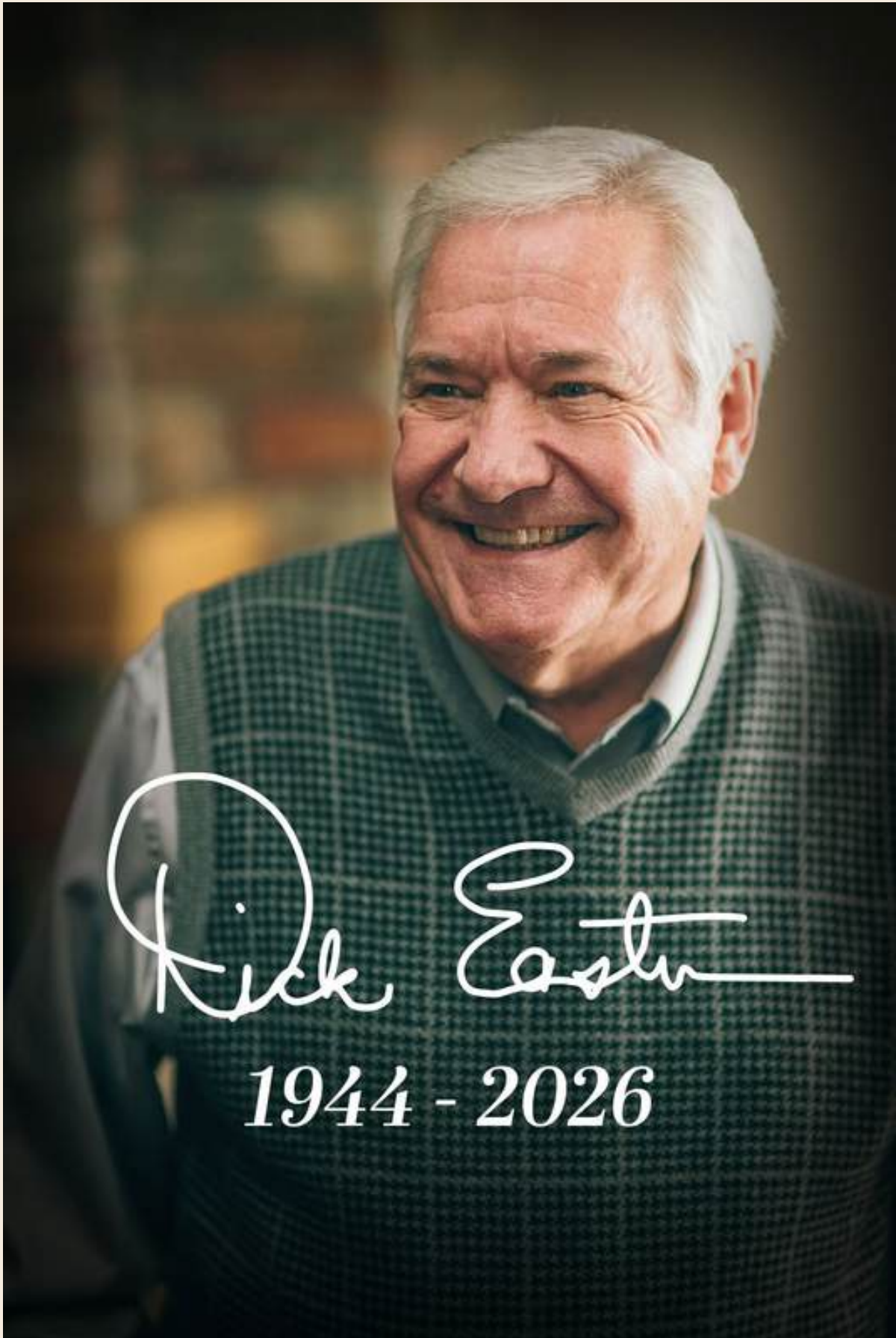

Dear Ministry Partners,

Over this past season, we have seen again how the simple act of sharing the gospel can lead to profound moments of transformation. In KwaDukuza, one such encounter unfolded in a deeply personal way, reminding us that when we step out in obedience, the Holy Spirit meets people right where they are, bringing freedom and hope into situations that have often felt unresolved for a long time.

At the same time, in Welkom, at our Literature Hub under the leadership of Rev Sechaba Molefe, there was a beautiful gathering centred around the Jesus Film and an open-air outreach. What stood out most was not only the engagement with the message, but the testimonies of healing that followed, pointing us again to the power of the name of Jesus and the reality of His work among us.

We also had the opportunity to gather in Durban at Gateway Church, hosted by Pastor Speedy Kisten, for a time of vision casting, mobilisation, and evangelism training. It was a meaningful space where leaders and members could come together, be equipped, and be reminded of our shared calling to reach our communities with clarity and boldness. Alongside these moments, I have personally had the privilege of spending time with some of our ministry partners and connecting with pastors' fraternal. These visits may seem simple, but they are deeply important. They strengthen relationships, create space for encouragement, and remind us that behind every outreach and every report are people faithfully serving. In many ways, this relational investment is what sustains the work and keeps it rooted.

As you read the stories that follow, we invite you to continue standing with us in prayer, for those who have responded to the gospel, for our teams and partners, and for open doors in every community we serve.

KWADUKUZA OUTREACH: HOPE MEETS REALITY

Pastor Lawrence shared a powerful account from a recent time of ministry in KwaDukuza, where the team stepped out to serve the surrounding communities with the message of the gospel.

The outreach took place near the kwaNanoti farms, where the team gathered in the afternoon, beginning with prayer before heading out. From there, they went from home to home, and along the roads where farm workers were returning from the fields, intentionally engaging people in conversation and sharing the good news of Jesus. There was a strong sense of openness, with many willing to listen, receive prayer, and engage in meaningful discussion. As part of their outreach, the team also made sure to connect people to ongoing support by sharing contact details for local pastors who could walk with them beyond that day.

It was in the midst of this that Pastor Lawrence recounts a particularly striking encounter.

They met a young man named Mseni, who, as they began speaking with him, asked a question that immediately revealed the weight he was carrying: Can the Jesus you are talking about help me in my situation?

The team paused and invited him to share more, creating space for him to speak openly. Mseni went on to describe a long-standing struggle he had been facing. Night after night, he experienced what he described as a spiritual presence that would come upon him while he slept, pressing on his chest and leaving him unable to breathe or call out. Despite seeking help through various traditional healers, nothing had brought him freedom or peace.

In that moment, Pastor Lawrence and the team responded with both compassion and conviction. They shared the gospel with him, explaining that Jesus is not distant from our struggles, but that He is able to bring deliverance, restoration, and peace. They invited Mseni to surrender his life to Christ and to trust Him fully. Mseni responded with openness and faith.

Pastor Selby, together with the rest of the team, prayed with him, laying hands on him and interceding in the name of Jesus. It was a moment marked by unity in prayer and a shared trust in the power of God to move in his life. They also encouraged him to become rooted in a Bible-based church community, ensuring that his decision would be supported by discipleship and ongoing spiritual growth. Two weeks later, Pastor Lawrence received a call from Mseni. This time, the tone was completely different.

With joy and relief, he shared that from the very day he gave his life to Jesus, the disturbances had stopped. He explained that there had been one final night where the presence seemed to return, but instead of fear, he responded in faith. He prayed and commanded it to leave in the name of Jesus, and from that moment, it never came back. Pastor Lawrence later shared this testimony during a prayer meeting, where the team gave thanks together, glorifying God for His faithfulness and the work He had done in Mseni's life.

Stories like this serve as a reminder that the gospel is not only a message we proclaim, but a living reality that meets people in the midst of their struggles. Outreach is not just about activity, but about encountering individuals where they are, bringing light into difficult places, and trusting the Holy Spirit to do what only He can do. As the team continues to labour in these communities, the heart remains the same: to faithfully sow the Word, to pray, to disciple, and to trust God for transformation in the lives of those they encounter.

As we entered the new year, our team gathered in the Vaal for a focused and intentional strategic planning meeting. The purpose was clear: to align our national efforts with both our local context and the international ministry guidelines that shape our global direction.

Strategic planning is an essential part of faithful stewardship. While our calling remains spiritual, our approach must also be thoughtful, organised, and intentional. During our time together, we reflected on the past season, evaluated outreach impact, identified growth areas, and mapped practical steps for the months ahead. A key focus of the meeting was ensuring that every area of our ministry reflects our central mandate: to carry Christ to everyone, everywhere, in every generation. This mandate requires depth and breadth. It calls us to engage urban and rural communities, young and old, church leaders and everyday believers. It challenges us to strengthen humanitarian outreach efforts that open doors in vulnerable communities. It compels us to equip churches with literature, training, and practical tools so that the Gospel can move far beyond a single event and into homes and hearts consistently.

We also worked through the international guidelines for the year, ensuring that our national strategies remain aligned with the broader global vision. This alignment strengthens unity across nations and keeps our mission clear and consistent. Importantly, this was not a once-off meeting. The year ahead will include follow-up planning sessions, reviews, and necessary adjustments as circumstances evolve. Ministry requires flexibility alongside conviction. As we respond to changing needs in communities, we remain committed to staying rooted in prayer, guided by Scripture, and aligned with our purpose.

We left the Vaal encouraged and unified. There is clarity for the road ahead, renewed commitment within the team, and a shared conviction that this year must be marked by both strategic focus and deep dependence on God.

As we move forward, we do so with one heart and one vision: to carry Christ to everyone, everywhere, in every generation.

Welkom Outreach: Testimonies of Healing and Hope

At Welkom Shalom Christian Centres Churches International, one of our valued Literature Hubs in the Free State, a special time of ministry recently brought together believers under the leadership of Rev Sechaba Molefe.

The gathering created space for people to encounter the truth and love of Christ in a tangible way. Through fellowship, the sharing of the Word, and intentional outreach, there was a strong sense of unity and expectation as the community came together. A key part of the event was the screening of the Jesus Film, accompanied by an open-air outreach. DURBAN VISION CASTING: EQUIPPING AND MOBILISING THE CHURCH

A recent gathering in Durban brought together church leaders and members for a focused time of vision casting, mobilisation, and evangelism training at Gateway Church, graciously hosted by Pastor Speedy Kisten.

The sessions were facilitated by EHC Board Chairperson Heinrich Smit and Ministry Director Pastor Hebert Mahuni, who led those present through both the heart and the practical outworking of evangelism. The time was centred on strengthening the local church's role in sharing the gospel, while also equipping believers with the confidence and tools to actively engage their communities. There was a strong emphasis on unity and collaboration, with encouragement for churches to work together in advancing the message of Christ. The gathering created space not only for teaching, but also for alignment, as leaders and members were reminded of the shared calling to reach those who have not yet encountered the gospel.

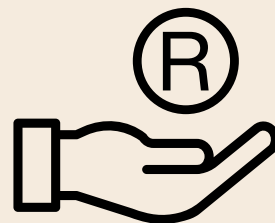
