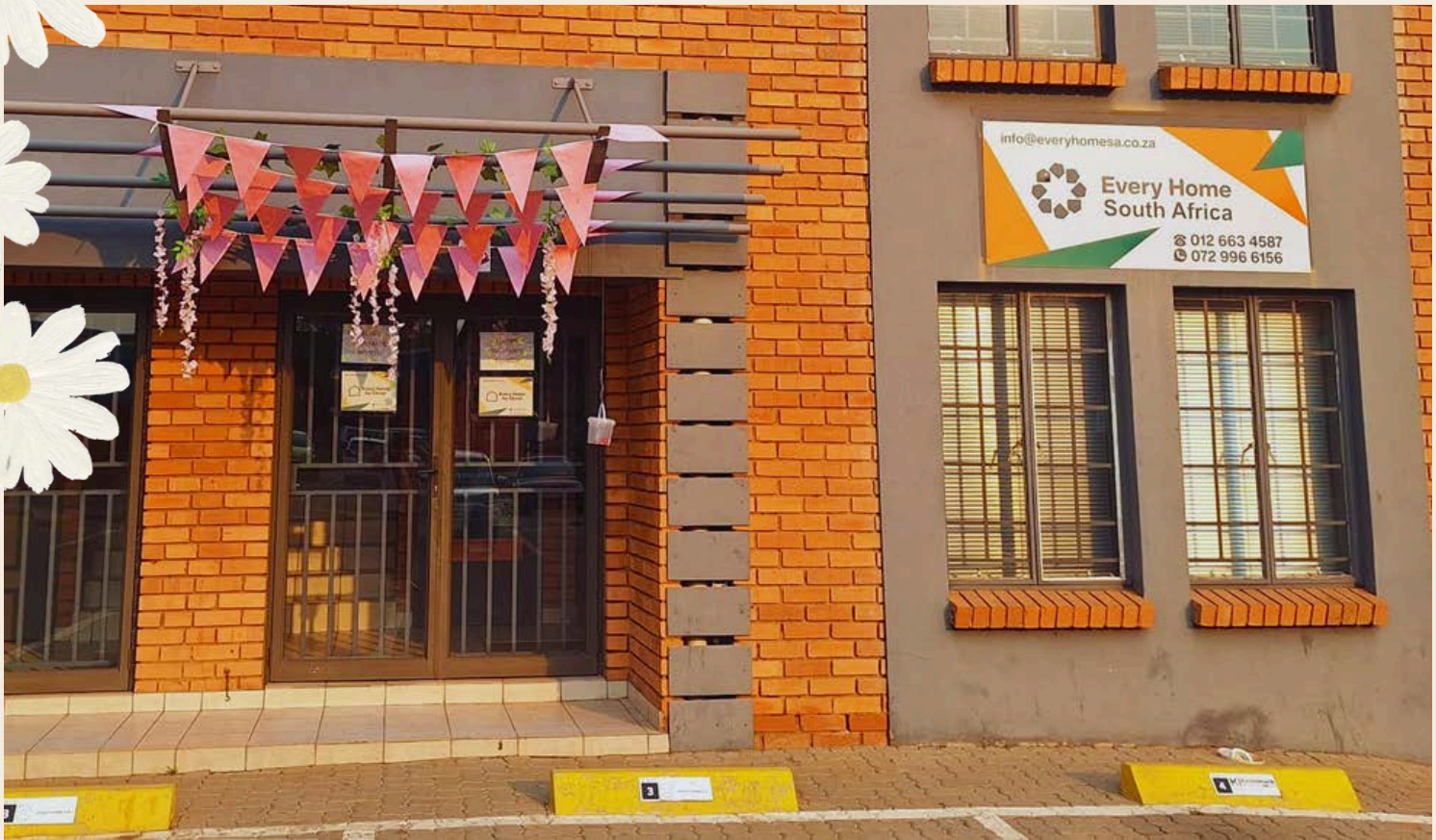
# ON THE MOVE WITH A FRESH LOOK

# WOMEN REACHING WOMEN: A CELEBRATION OF STRENGTH AND FAITH IN THE VAAL

On the 30th of August, the Vaal Hub joined hands with CFI Tshepiso, CFI Bophelong, CFI Mabopane, and CFI Thembisa to close out Women's Month with a powerful time of fellowship. These church plants, all birthed through the work of Every Home South Africa, came together with one heart: to see women uplifted, encouraged, and equipped for the work of the Lord. Over 60 women gathered in one accord, ready to receive from God and to strengthen one another.

The Word was brought forth by two mighty women of faith - Pastor Abigail Mahuni and Pastor Gugu Simela Ka Tshabalala. Pastor Gugu, freshly ordained during the International Word Fest and 30th Anniversary in Harare, stood alongside Pastor Abigail as vessels set apart for God's use. Their preaching stirred the hearts of the women gathered, calling them to pursue education, to work diligently with their hands, and to walk responsibly before the Lord. The message was clear: even in the face of trials, women can rise up, excel, and glorify God in all they do. The encouragement rang out for women to stand together, to walk in integrity, and to serve faithfully.

## **A Testimony of Deliverance**

Among the women present was a precious soul who had strayed from the Lord and turned to false prophets for help. She had been instructed to swallow five stones each day as part of a dark ritual. But the Spirit of God rose up within her—she swallowed one stone and was immediately convicted. She prayed, rejected the deception, and threw the remaining stones away. What followed was a fierce battle, as tormenting voices mocked and oppressed her, even speaking through the barking of dogs and the singing of birds. When she first came among the believers, her mind seemed broken, and many thought she had lost her sanity. Yet, the church prayed, stood in the gap, and trusted the Lord for her deliverance. Today, she is clothed and in her right mind, part of this very outreach, a living testimony that Jesus still sets the captives free.

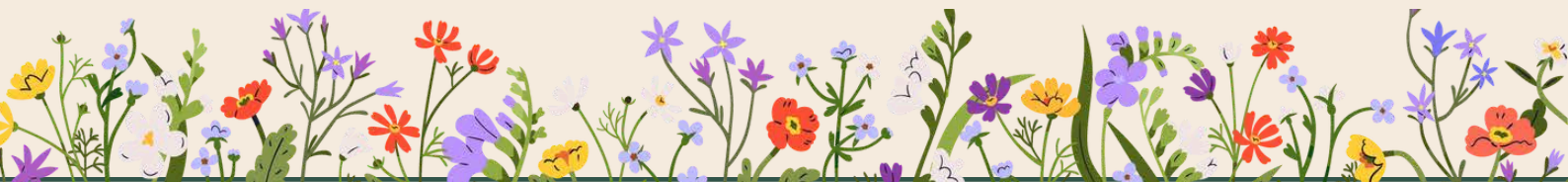

## A Joyful Milestone

This year marks five years since Mkhulu Tshabalala began serving with Every Home for Christ South Africa, a journey filled with both trials and great blessings. His story is one of perseverance, faith, and the goodness of God at work.

It all began in 2020, when Mkhulu attended OMW training led by Pastor Hebert Mahuni. Participants were challenged to share the gospel with twenty people, a call that stirred his heart. That same week, however, the national lockdown was announced. At the time, Mkhulu had been unemployed for nearly three years, and life was far from easy. Yet even in hardship, ministry did not stop.

Together with the evangelism team, Mkhulu helped pioneer street ministry in those early days of lockdown. With church buildings closed, they mounted sound equipment on a car and preached the gospel extension by extension. It was in this season that he formally joined Every Home South Africa as a Focus Leader, serving alongside his partner.

From there, the Lord continued to open doors. Mkhulu served as an administrator for one year before stepping into the role of full-time Mobile Training Coordinator. This position not only shaped his ministry but also had a profound impact on his personal life. After a long season of challenges, he and his partner were married, and in time, they welcomed their beautiful child, Baby Eliseo Bandile Tshabalala. In August 2025, after five years of faithful service in one of the church plants, Mkhulu and his wife were both ordained in Harare during the CFI Word Fest and 30th Anniversary. Standing together in ordination was a powerful testimony of God's goodness and faithfulness over their lives. Mkhulu's journey is a reminder that what begins with small steps of obedience can grow into a life-changing ministry.

From unemployment and uncertainty to full-time service, marriage, parenthood, and ordination, God has indeed been good. All glory belongs to Him.

## A Joyful Milestone

Pastor Gladys Moitheri Madikane was born again in 1997 at Christian Fellowship Ministry in the Free State and baptized in 1999. From the beginning, her heart longed to serve the Lord. After relocating to the Vaal in 2000, she studied at Welkom College and became active in church life, singing in the choir and later serving as a youth leader and worshiper at Fountain of Life Church. It was there, in 2013, that she first recognized the call of God on her life. In 2015 she was ordained as a pastor and entrusted with leading the worship team.

In 2019, Gladys faced a challenging season, but the Lord was faithful to draw her back into ministry. In 2020, Evangelist Tshabalala and Pastor Joseph introduced her to Every Home for Christ. Despite the fear of the pandemic, she joined them on the streets, preaching, praying, and seeing many come to Christ. She remembers this as a season of God's protection and power, when even in hardship, the gospel bore fruit. That same year, with the encouragement of Pastors Hebert and Abigail Mahuni, Gladys planted CFI Bophelo on 9 August 2020. The church began in the garage where she was living, grew into a temporary stand, and eventually built a structure. Each step was a testimony of God's provision and faithfulness.

In September 2023, she relocated to Cape Town to serve as pastor of CFI Khayelitsha. There she found believers already grounded in the Word but in need of shepherding. Through patient leadership, she has strengthened the church and helped the ministry thrive. Alongside her pastoral role, she also serves as the Mobile Training Coordinator for Every Home for Christ in the Western Cape, equipping others to take the gospel to every home.

Today Pastor Gladys reflects on her journey with gratitude. From youth ministry in the Vaal, to street evangelism during COVID, to planting and pastoring churches, she testifies that God has been faithful in every season. Her heart remains to see lives transformed, families restored, and communities reached with the Good News of Jesus Christ.

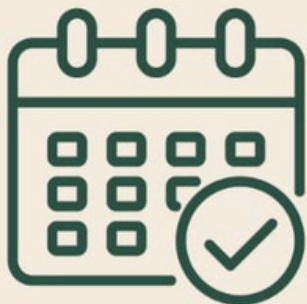

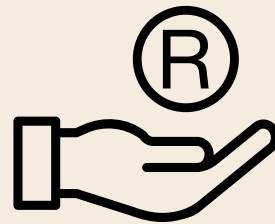
