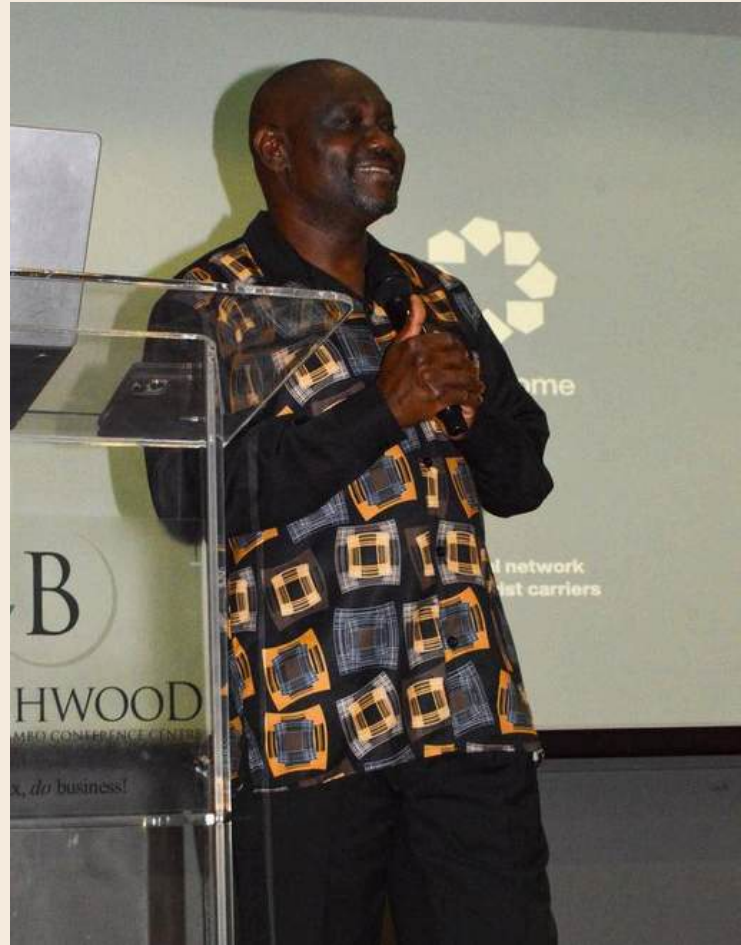

# A YEAR OF PRAYERFUL TOGETHERNESS

As we look back over this year, one of the most treasured rhythms that has shaped our life at the Every Home South Africa office has been our Tuesday morning prayer gatherings. What began as a simple weekly touchpoint quickly grew into a steady heartbeat for our team - a space where we consistently set aside time to seek the Lord together, align our hearts with His purposes, and lift up the people and communities we serve.

What has made these mornings even more meaningful is how they have overflowed beyond our internal team. Throughout the year, we have been joined by neighbours from nearby offices who felt drawn to the atmosphere of peace and expectation in our boardroom. Pastors stopping by to collect literature would linger and pray with us. Visitors, volunteers, and friends of the ministry would find themselves swept up into our circle, sharing testimonies, burdens, and encouragements.

Each Tuesday carried its own flavour - sometimes filled with intercession for the nations, sometimes soaked in quiet worship, sometimes erupting with joy and gratitude as homes were reached, lives were touched, and new testimonies flowed in from the field. It became a weekly reminder that prayer is not a ritual, but a relationship; not a task, but a privilege; not a department within the ministry, but the very ground from which our obedience grows.

This year showed us again that when we gather in unity, even in a simple office on a Tuesday morning, God moves. He strengthens. He heals. He directs. He breathes fresh hope into tired places. As we step toward a new year, we carry deep gratitude for every person who sat around that table with us - whether once or every week. Thank you for adding your voice, your faith, your presence. We pray these gatherings will continue to be a place of refreshing, equipping, and profound fellowship as we keep seeking His heart for every home, every family, and every child across our nation. May the prayers we sowed this year continue to bear fruit in the years to come.

## BRINGING CHRIST'S LOVE TO EVERY CORNER OF EKURHULENI

Across the Ekurhuleni region this past outreach period, our teams and partners continued to bring the message of Christ's love to schools, churches, children's homes, and community groups. One of the faithful hands in this work has been Koos van der Merwe from Alberton, a retired school principal whose heart for people – especially young people – has shaped countless moments of ministry. Through his long partnership with Every Home for Christ and his involvement with the Gideons, he has used our literature not simply as material, but as tools for connection, creativity, and Gospel truth.

In visiting the Ekurhuleni School for the Deaf, the Gospel had to cross unique communication barriers. Yet with patience, visual storytelling, and gentle persistence, the message landed – and more than 200 learners, along with dozens of teachers, responded with unmistakable joy and understanding.

At the Ezibeleni School for Physically Disabled Children in Katlehong, the familiar illustration of “the five fingers of God's hand with your name in it” once again proved its power. Children engaged wholeheartedly, leaning into the simplicity and hope of the message, reminding us that the Gospel is beautifully accessible no matter our circumstances.

From there, ministry extended into spaces of deep need for comfort and encouragement. An elderly fellowship group at Change the Bible Church received Scripture, prayer, and renewed assurance of God's faithfulness. At the Abraham Kriel Children's Home, what began as a time of sharing the Word blossomed into laughter, singing, and meaningful connection. And at Rise and Shine Church in Katlehong, the welcome was warm and the fellowship rich as people of all ages gathered to hear the Good News.

Across each stop, what stood out was not simply the activity but the atmosphere – hearts open, communities hungry for hope, and people responding to the Gospel in ways big and small. These visits, supported by your prayers, resources, and involvement with Every Home for Christ, continue to remind us why we do this work: because every home, every school, every gathering place is an opportunity for someone to encounter Christ.

We remain grateful for all who labour alongside us, formal partners and everyday volunteers alike. The harvest in Ekurhuleni is real and ongoing, and together we celebrate what God continues to do in these precious communities.

# EQUIPPING THE CALLED: EVANGELISM TRAINING WITH THE SALVATION ARMY

This month, our team had the privilege of partnering with The Salvation Army Southern Africa Territory to equip their cadets for the work of evangelism. What unfolded over two days was far more than a training event - it became a space of shared purpose, renewed passion, and courageous witness.

From the very first session, the cadets engaged with open hearts and eager minds. We explored the foundations of sharing the Gospel with clarity, compassion, and confidence, grounding every conversation in the love of Christ. Day two brought practice into action. The training concluded with a certificate presentation at the Salvation Army College for Officer Training. It was a beautiful moment of blessing and recognition, celebrating not only their completion of the program but their readiness to carry the Good News into the world.

We are grateful for the partnership, the hospitality, and the spirit of unity that marked these days. As these cadets step into ministry across Southern Africa, we pray that the seeds planted will grow into bold, compassionate evangelists who bring Christ's hope to every home they enter.

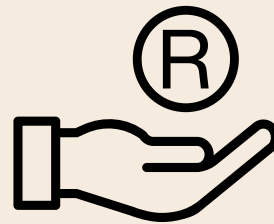
