SOWING SEEDS IN KOPPIES: REACHING THE HARVEST FIELD WITH THE GOSPEL

Pastor Mosiuoa recently spent time ministering in Koppies in the Free State, where he continues to reach out to the farming communities in the surrounding areas with the Good News of Jesus Christ.

Early in the morning, before tools are picked up and daily labour begins, Ps Mosiuoa meets with farmworkers to share the Word, offer prayer, and speak life into their day. Under the open sky, with dew still fresh on the ground, these gatherings become sacred spaces, moments of stillness where hearts are stirred and hope is restored.

At one of the farms, known for its taxidermy work, both the workers and the farm owners joined the gathering. Touched by the message, the farmer and his wife invited Ps Mosiuoa to return, a clear sign that the Holy Spirit is at work softening hearts and building bridges across communities.

This outreach is part of a broader calling. Ps Mosiuoa is actively involved in schools, street evangelism and marketplace ministry. His heart is to take the Gospel to where the people are, not waiting for them to enter church buildings, but meeting them in their daily lives, just as Jesus did.

From farm roads to classroom corridors, God is opening doors for His Word to go forth. The work in Koppies is a powerful reminder that the harvest is truly plentiful. As Ps Mosiuoa continues to plant seeds of truth and love, we trust the Lord of the Harvest to bring the increase.

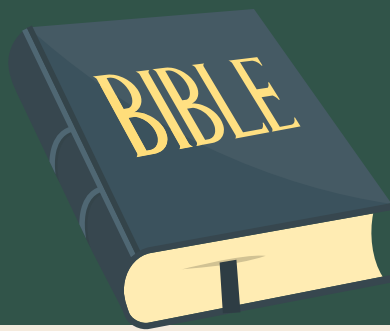
May this spirit of giving continue to grow, and may the seeds you've planted in your students bear lasting fruit in their lives and in the lives of all those they touch.

From there, we visited Tsholetsa Disability Care Centre, where we were warmly welcomed and shown around. This past Father's Day, the women and youth of Nancefield Baptist Church in Eldorado Park hosted a beautiful lunch to honour the men in their congregation. Held at the church on John Pop Circle, Extension 6, the celebration was a heartfelt gesture of appreciation and unity.

The youth prepared thoughtful decorations for the tables, and the ladies lovingly cooked and served the meal. It was a special moment to affirm the importance of fathers in both the family and the faith community.

The Bible reminds us of the critical role that fathers play. They are called to be servant leaders in their homes, examples of Christ's love, and spiritual anchors for their families. When we support and uplift fathers, we strengthen families, churches, and entire communities. A godly father points his children toward the heart of the Heavenly Father, showing them what it means to live with integrity, purpose, and love.

While it was a day of celebration, we also carry a deep concern for Eldorado Park. The community continues to face challenges, and earlier this month, residents were shaken by another tragic shooting. The pain and fear caused by violence highlight the urgent need for prayer, healing, and lasting change. As we reflect on the importance of fathers, we are reminded how vital it is to raise up godly men who can lead with wisdom and compassion. We ask you to continue praying for Eldorado Park. And pray that families would be strengthened, with fathers taking their place as loving leaders and peacemakers.

REACHING SESHEGO: FAITHFUL WOMEN ON MISSION

Evangelism efforts continue to flourish in Seshego, Limpopo, where a group of dedicated women, including retired schoolteachers, nurses, and social workers, are faithfully sharing the Gospel throughout their community. They work independently, using their own limited funds and public transport to reach those around them. We are privileged to support their ministry with Gospel literature and occasional visits from Evangelist Chili for training or screenings of the Jesus Film.

Seshego is a rapidly growing township situated about 10 km northwest of Polokwane. With a population of over 426,000 people, primarily Sepedi-speaking, the need for Gospel outreach is significant. The township is divided into eight zones and continues to expand as more people move in from nearby rural areas.

Recent ministry efforts focused on familiar sites including Seshego Hospital, the clinics in Zones 2, 3, and 4, the Department of Labour, LADGAC, and two local rehabilitation centres, including the University of Change. Gospel materials were distributed, including *The Gospel of John* (in English and Sepedi), *The Way to God* (Sepedi), and *God Loves You* (English). These were given to individuals who had not received them previously.

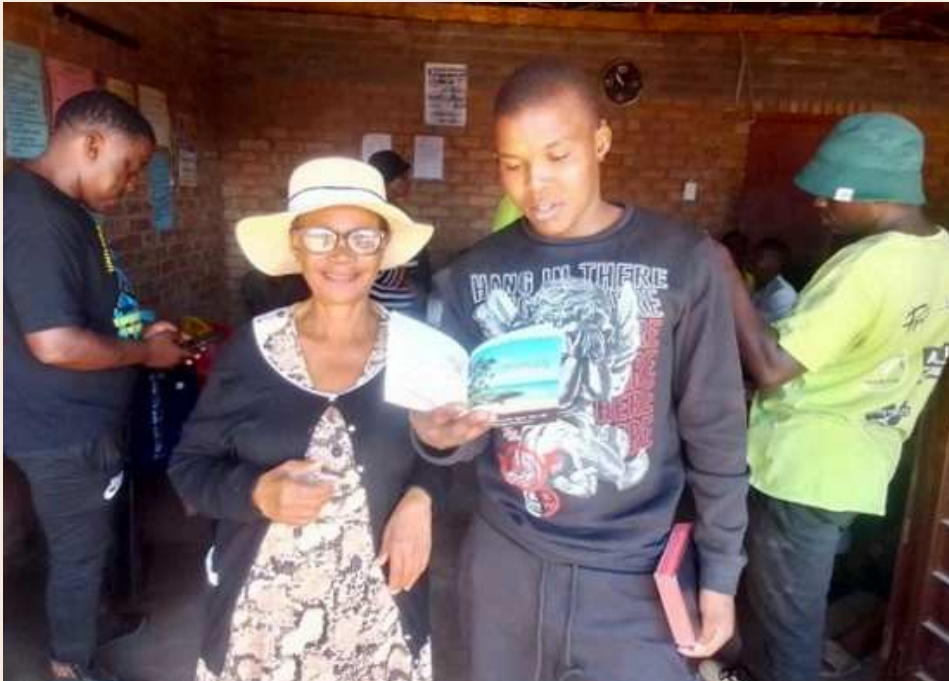
School evangelism remains a core part of this outreach. The team visited Mohlakaneng High, Masedibu High, Bokamoso High, Boiketlo Primary, Mashupyetladi Primary, CM Sehlapelo Primary, ME Makgato High, Peter Nchabeleng High, Grace & Hope School for Children with Disabilities, and Esau Mosedame Primary. Two new schools, Alf Makaleng Primary and David Nkwana Primary, were added to the programme, and every child received Gospel literature.

These faithful women may serve quietly, but their impact is loud in heaven. Through simple obedience and tireless love, they are reaching homes, schools, and hospitals with the truth of God's Word. Their work reminds us that ministry does not require great resources, only great faith.

Please continue to pray for them as they serve their community with strength and compassion. We look forward to seeing what God will continue to do through them in Seshego.

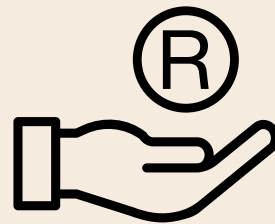
