REACHING FARM WORKERS ACROSS THE NORTHERN CAPE

Every Home for Christ South Africa is excited to be partnering with Pastor Tom Dawson as we continue expanding the reach of the gospel into the Northern Cape.

Based in Kakamas, Pastor Tom has faithfully built an incredible ministry serving farm workers across the region. Each week, he visits farm after farm, ministering to more than 2,000 workers employed on the area's citrus and agricultural farms. Through consistent outreach and relationship-building, he has established a remarkable ministry that is making a lasting impact in communities that are often difficult to reach.

Last month, our team spent a week in Kakamas alongside Pastor Tom, joining him as he visited the farms where he regularly ministers. Together they participated in outreaches, met local communities, and experienced first-hand the incredible work taking place across the region.

The team returned deeply encouraged by both the scale of the ministry and Pastor Tom's heart for the people he serves. The visit strengthened the vision for working together and marked the beginning of an exciting new partnership.

We are grateful to welcome them as part of the Every Home for Christ family and look forward to seeing how God continues to open doors as we work together to reach even more communities with the hope of the gospel.

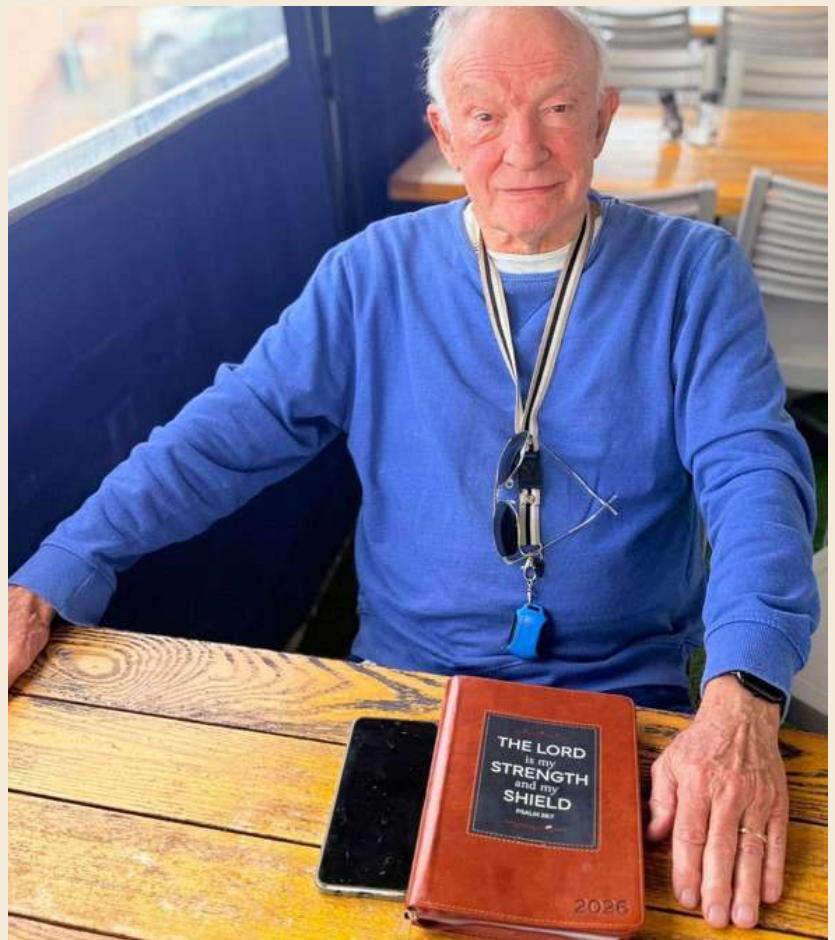
HONOURING A LEGACY OF PRAYER

A special moment during our recent travels was the opportunity for our Ministry Director, Dr Herbert Mahuni, to meet Rev Cecil Peasley for the very first time.

Rev Peasley served as the third National Director of Every Home for Christ South Africa from 1985 to 1991, and his faithful leadership left a lasting impact on the ministry. One of his most significant contributions was the establishment and expansion of the School of Prayer across South Africa, helping to cultivate a culture of prayer that continues to influence the work of Every Home today.

During his tenure, more than 500 Schools of Prayer were established using the teaching materials developed by Dr Dick Eastman. These schools equipped believers across the country to deepen their prayer lives and strengthened local churches to become centres of intercession for their communities.

Meeting Rev Peasley was a meaningful reminder that the ministry we carry forward today has been built on the faithful service and sacrifice of those who have gone before us. We are grateful for his legacy and for the foundation of prayer that continues to underpin the mission of Every Home for Christ in South Africa.





EXPLORING New FRONTIERS in Ministry

June was a month of new opportunities and encouraging growth as our Prayer Ministry team stepped into communities and ministry contexts that had never before been part of our outreach.

One of the month's most significant highlights was a visit to Kakamas, where our National Director, Ps Herbert Mahuni, together with Ps Abigail, Ps Mkhulu and Evangelist Joseph, partnered with Evangelist Tom Dawson to experience a thriving ministry among farm workers. This unique outreach opened the team's eyes to a community that is often overlooked, providing opportunities to share the Gospel, equip believers through evangelism and prayer training, and encourage farm workers to become ambassadors for Christ within their own communities.

Closer to home, Pastor Lucas continued to faithfully serve communities in Tembisa, providing evangelism and prayer training in areas that had previously been difficult to access. Working alongside local churches, volunteers went door-to-door sharing the hope of Christ while also distributing donated PVC sheeting to families whose homes were vulnerable to winter rain. The practical support opened many doors for meaningful conversations and demonstrated Christ's love in tangible ways.

Discipleship continued to flourish despite the challenges of the winter season. Existing home prayer groups remained committed, with attendance staying strong even on the coldest days. One particularly inspiring group continued gathering outdoors each week for prayer, refusing to let the weather hinder their commitment to seeking God together. Workplace ministry also continued to bear fruit. At one business, daily prayer has become part of the company culture, with both management and staff gathering together each morning before the workday begins. Leaders report greater unity, peace and a growing awareness of God's presence in their workplace.

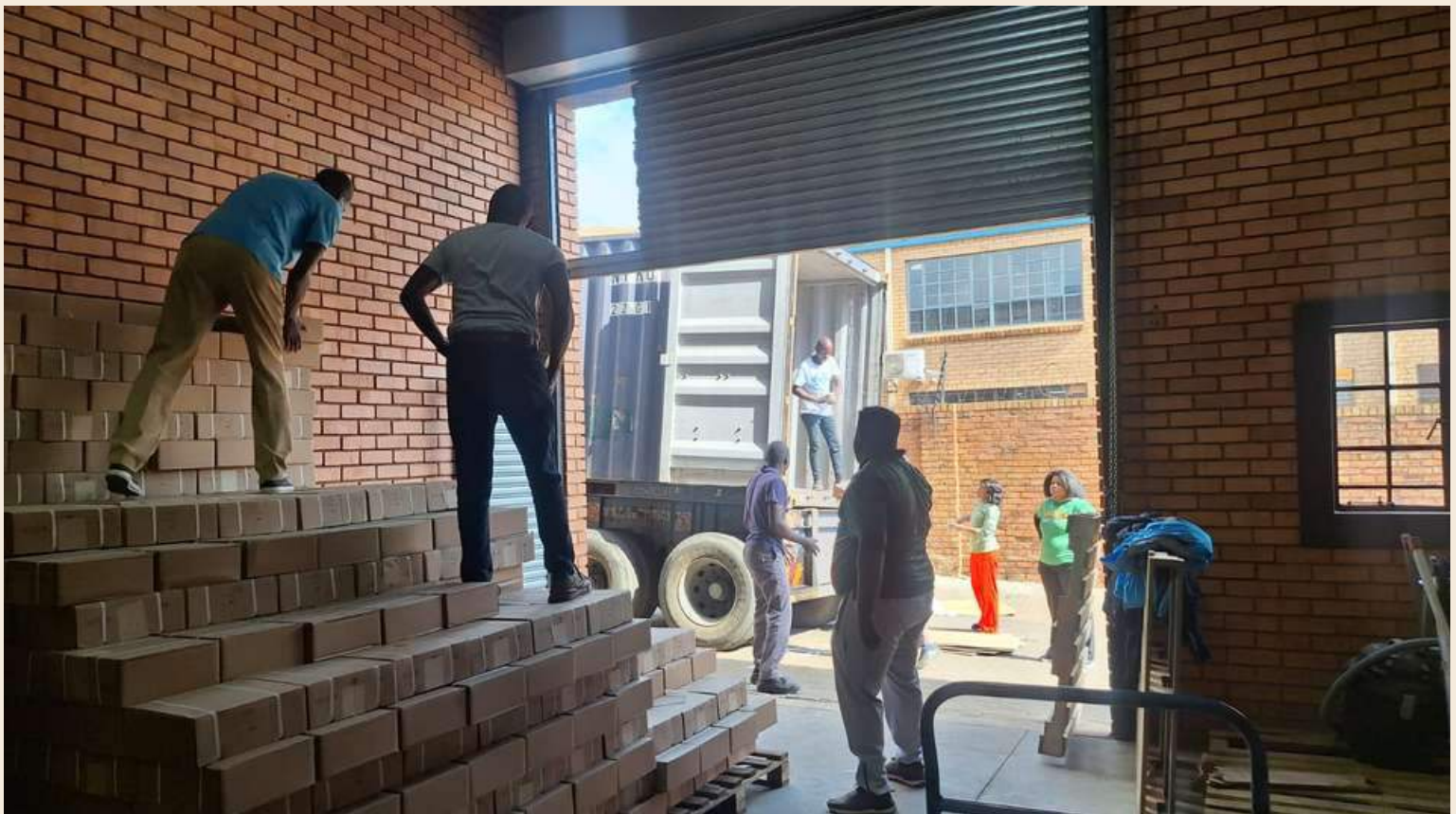

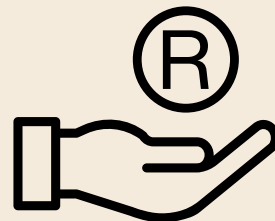
