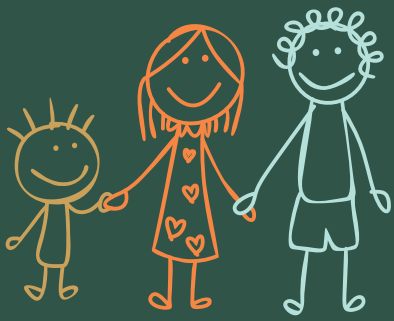

SHAPING LITTLE HEARTS: WHY CHILDREN'S MINISTRY MATTERS

April is recognised as Children's Ministry Month, a special time to reflect on the incredible privilege and responsibility of investing in the lives of children. At Every Home South Africa, this month serves as a beautiful reminder that ministry is not only about reaching adults. It is about planting seeds of hope, faith, kindness, and truth in young hearts while they are still growing.

Children are not "the church of tomorrow." They are part of the Church today. Throughout Scripture, we see the importance God places on children. Jesus Himself welcomed children openly, even when the adults around Him tried to push them aside.

Matthew 19:14

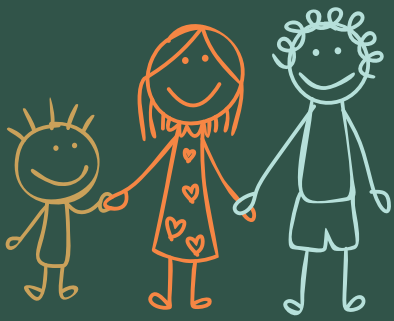

“Train up a child in the way he should go, and when he is old he will not depart from it.”

In a world where children face increasing pressures, confusion, loneliness, and insecurity, the Church has an opportunity to be a place of safety, joy, and truth. Ministry to children is not just about entertainment or keeping them occupied. It is about showing them the love of Christ in practical, tangible ways.

It is about teaching them:

- That they were created with purpose
- That kindness matters
- That they never have to face life alone

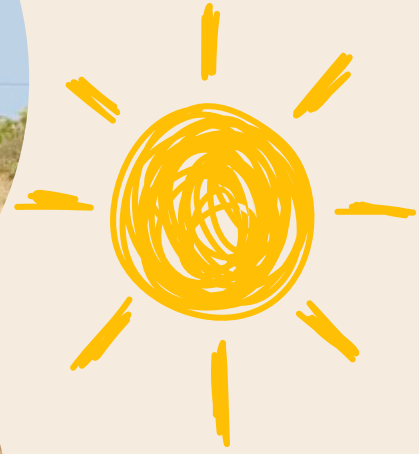

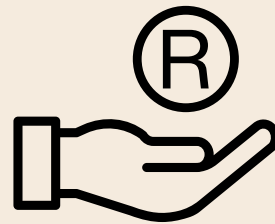
