FROM THE FIELD: A SERIOUS REFLECTION

FROM EVANGELIST CHILI

Ga-Marishane Vlakplaas is in Limpopo, Sekhukhuni District Municipality and is situated about 95km from the capital city of Polokwane. After researching the area, we discovered that the area is without a church and that the few Christians that are in the area need to travel to nearby villages to attend church services. In short, Ga Marishane is a very neglected area without a church, clinic, or proper water supply.

After our initial research, we planned an outreach campaign for two weeks in the area that would run from the 1st to the 11th of June 2022. We aimed to win souls and plant a new church in the community whilst also doing our usual home-to-home outreach, school ministry, and evening tent crusade.

Our outreach had been going well until an unfortunate incident that happened on the last night of our tent Crusade.

On the 11th we had prepared for the service as usual and started around 6pm. Just a few minutes after we started, a gang of men approached our tent and demanded that we stop the service with immediate effect. Pastor Klass Mokomane, the crusade leader and our volunteer, tried to chat with the men and find out what their problem with service was when they suddenly attacked him. Some of the congregation in the tent tried to help the Pastor but quickly realised that the gang were carrying knives and one man even had a gun. The congregation was quickly escorted out of the tent for their safety. While they were exiting, they saw that the gang of men were using the tent's side poles to hit the pastor while saying that the tent had been making noise in the community.

While the attack proceeded, one of our volunteers - Mr Tambo - tried to defend the Pastor but unfortunately, he was stabbed twice. The gang then slashed the tent and ran away while shooting into the sky. Luckily Pastor Mokomane was not badly injured and he managed to rush Mr Tambo, who was bleeding, to the hospital in Jane Furse. After leaving the hospital, Pastor Mokoman went to the nearest police station to open a case. Mr Tabo was discharged the following day and the police visited the scene to record statements. To this day, no one has been arrested.

Evangelist Chili's story is a reminder that while we are charged with the Lord's work, we must always be vigilant when we enter communities where we are strangers. We pray that the men who attacked our volunteers are found and arrested.
